What is the VFC Program?

The Vaccines for Children (VFC) program helps families of children who may not otherwise have access to vaccines. VFC is an entitlement program (a right granted by law) for **eligible children, age 18 and below** who:

- Are eligible for Medicaid
- Have no health insurance
- Are Native American or Alaska Native
- Have health insurance, but it does not cover immunization

Vaccines are free to children 18 and under who meet the requirements listed above.

Immunizations given include Diphtheria, Tetanus, Pertussis, Polio, Measles, Mumps, Rubella, Haemophilus Influenza Type b (Hib), Hepatitis A, Hepatitis B, HPV (adolescent), Influenza, Meningococcal Conjugate, Pneumococcal Conjugate, Rotavirus and Chickenpox. TB Skin Tests are also available.

THE CLINIC IS BY APPOINTMENT ONLY.

You must bring your child's IMMUNIZATION RECORD with you to the clinic.
